



SPECTRA

Art works on paper are inherently fragile. Exposure to light can cause fading of media and can also yellow, darken and weaken paper.

Paul Chapman's work explores the use of sunlight as a vital component in the layering of his paper prints. Through a process of masking off areas and exposure to direct sunlight Chapman's prints have a sun bleached pattern etched into them. Often reworking, recycling and adding further layers to complete his works.





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VANESSA YORK

INTRODUCTION TO NATURAL PERFUMERY

Create your own natural perfume. In Natural Perfumery all materials are derived from plants, or in a few cases from animals, for example beeswax, ambergris and civet. In this hands-on workshop you will experience up to 50 different aromatics and learn some techniques to evaluate them. You will develop a basic understanding of base, middle and top notes, and the building blocks of perfume composition. Learn about the history of perfume, including the advent of synthetics in the 20th century and the recent renaissance of Natural Perfumery. 


REFUNDS
