STUDIO SPACES

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A range of studio hire options are available at the Studio One Toi Tū precinct. We have a range of studio options and are one of the few precincts in Auckland to offer access to 'messy' workshops suitable for ceramicists, sculptors and object makers. We also offer a number of open studio spaces that can be hired individually or collectively for making, meetings, workshops or temporary events.

We are located in the heart of central Auckland with free wi-fi, kitchen facilities and the possibility for 24-hour access. Contact us to find out how we can support you.

THE CELL BLOCK

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The Cell Block studio spaces are private studios available for hire at a rate of \$78 per week. It comes with 24-hour access and is hired on a monthly basis.

VILLA STUDIO

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A shared studio space with access to the sculpture workshop and prep room is available for hire at a rate of \$175 per week. It comes with 24-hour access and is hired on a monthly basis.

WORKSHOP HIRE

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Studio One Toi Tū has two 'messy' workshops that can be hired at an hourly rate with access to our ceramic and printmaking equipment. If you have a project and need that extra space to make it happen, this is the option for you.



DOWNSIDE UP

Downside Up centres upon our formed preconceptions with objects. Preexisting, ready-made objects are broken, stretched and assembled in unusual combinations with intention and reveal new spatial relationships between inhabitant, space and object. They provoke fresh awareness and inquiry into our relationships with the urban architectural environment we find ourselves within everyday.

Males' work is inspired by installation artists such as Julie Becker and Nicolas Lamas, whose practices also investigate the relationship between space and object.

Urwin, influenced by current pandemic world events, explores ways in which society balances control and freedom. The clay works are confined to set spaces, but appear as though they are seeking out connection. From anxiety to contentment, desire and despair, this series deconstructs elements of the human condition.

OLIVER CAIN

FUN FILLED BODY CANDY

Colourful, bright, lush and juicy. In this series of work, Cain has turned an erogenous zone into a pliable and universal material. Ceramic nipples, all different in size and formal set-up and spray-painted in different colours, sit within old-school wooden frames. Their intensely theatrical design offers up the complexities we face around certain parts of our body as a performative act. The framed nipples are viewed, interpreted, compared or contrasted with viewers' library of mental images. Cain questions the traditional conventions of beauty and sex(iness) and offers a new vision of the human body "imperfect, irregular, in constant evolution and dissolution but enchanting and remarkable" he says.

MEGA MOUTHS #2

This exhibition *Mega Mouths #2*, created by Yates, is made up of clay megaphones made over the last two years. The intention is to empower others to raise their voices, share their ideas, and even be a bit playful. You may notice some works are more literal while others humorous. Yates invited fellow potters to take the megaphone concept and create their own voice amplifier for a previous exhibition at Auckland Studio Potters. This work is part of her ongoing aim to build inclusive communities.

EMMA SAVAGE

HAYES PADDOCK

Depicting the neighbourhood she grew up in, Emma Savage's debut exhibition highlights the peaceful, familiar and nostalgic aspects of New Zealand suburbia. Hayes Paddock, Hamilton East is an example of a relatively intact, architecturally coherent suburb that exemplifies state housing ideals of the 1940s. In her acrylic paintings, these structures along with their mature gardens, renovations and other traces of those who have occupied these dwellings over the last 80 years are observed and celebrated.

JACK WOLF

KAURI AND TOHORĀ

"When hope feels lost, return to the wisdom of the natural world" Saddened by the endangered state of the Kauri tree, which has been heavily impacted by colonization and is now under attack from dieback disease, Wolf was drawn to an ancient Māori legend, which tells of the ancestry between the Kauri tree and Tohorā (whale). The story illuminates indigenous healing methods, which inspired Wolf to create contemporary jewellery pieces made with Rongoā Māori principles. He sees the pieces as talisman to guide those who wear them through the grief and loss of this environmental crisis, a healing ritual for modern times. Wolf, who is pākeha, celebrates indigenous healing wisdom and advocates a collective need to return to ancient ways.

ANTOINETTE RATCLIFFE

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POTTER'S FIELD

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In Western tradition, the term 'Potter's Field' is given to land used as a common grave for those unclaimed or unknown. Ratcliffe, a professional taxidermist, felt an affinity with the term, which could also be applied to her freezer. Taking an anthropomorphic approach to taxidermy, Ratcliffe's pieces prompt a dialogue around the relationships between people, the land and wildlife.

Ratcliffe uses only ethically sourced specimens. She has taxidermy pieces in public collections held by the NZ Bird Society, Zealandia, North Otago Museum, Upper Hutt Predator Free Trust, and in many private collections around New Zealand.

FELIX PRYOR

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ARROWS FALLING FROM THE SUN

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Imps, angels, kings and Christs – Felix Pryor's first solo exhibition is a celebration of all that is speculative and fantastical. Inspired by the alternate worlds of science fiction and fantasy, as well as the Western canon's own foundational myths and legends, Pryor splices found images into detail-rich, hand-cut collage, which dissolve existing storylines and reassemble them into new narrative possibilities.

VELVETEEN PAINTINGS

Taking inspiration from a favourite childhood story The Velveteen Rabbit by Margery Williams.

Velveteen Paintings features mix media works on canvas, which use recycled materials and are machine stitched and stretched onto black velveteen. Keen works intuitively, being sensitive to the precarious and fragile nature of existence, her relationships with others and her connection with the natural world. Keen's aim is that the work reflects how human vulnerability can prompt change and motivate us to become more authentic versions of ourselves.

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

MOKUHANGA WORKSHOP

In this weekend workshop, students will learn about mokuhanga and create their own postcard sized prints. Mokuhanga has a long history in Japan and is best known for the Edo period ukiyo-e prints. The process uses water-based inks and is executed with a handheld baren instead of a printing press. Beginners will work with partly pre-cut plates. With support from the tutor, you will carve a plate for printing. Returning students can work with blank plates and will go through the process of establishing registration marks on the design and the block. Bring your own sketches or work with simple designs that are available.



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THROW IT DOWN

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An intensive eight-week ceramics course for those wanting to learn the basics of contemporary clay making on the wheel. This introductory course is ideal for students wanting to learn how to throw a variety of domestic shapes including cups, bowls and cylinders. 
