STUDIO SPACES

_

We have a range of studio options and are one of the few precincts in Auckland to offer access to 'messy' workshops suitable for ceramicists, sculptors and object makers. We also offer a number of open studio spaces that can be hired individually or collectively for making, meetings, workshops or temporary events.

We are located in the heart of central Auckland with free wi-fi, kitchen facilities and the possibility for 24-hour access. Contact us to find out how we can support you.

THE CELL BLOCK

_

The Cell Block studio spaces are private studios available for hire at a rate of \$78 per week. It comes with 24-hour access and is hired on a monthly basis.

VILLA STUDIO

_

A shared studio space with access to the sculpture workshop is available for hire at a rate of \$175 per week. It comes with 24-hour access and is hired on a monthly basis.

WORKSHOP HIRE

Studio One Toi Tū has two 'messy' workshops that can be hired at an hourly rate with access to our ceramic and printmaking equipment. If you have a project and need that extra space to make it happen, this is the option for you.



ARCHIVES OF THE AUCKLAND PRIDE CENTRE



In addition, it presented a diverse range of LGBTQIA+ events, including the renowned Annual Coming Out Day Parade, Tea Dances, Art Exhibitions, Poetry Readings, and the 1990 Auckland Gay Mardi Gras.

Throughout the 1990s, The Pride Centre played a significant role in advocating for queer issues and scrutinising the stance of local politicians on LGBTQIA+ issues.

WHERE ARE YOU FROM?


NAOMI AZOULAY

Artist Naomi Azoulay draws upon her own migrant experiences to capture the rich cultural diversity of Tāmaki Makaurau's communities. Through her artwork, she prompts viewers to contemplate the assumptions that often arise when encountering people from different backgrounds.

When people of ethnic backgrounds are asked, "Where are you from?" this question implies that there is a simple answer, that they are from one specific place or background. In reality, people's backgrounds are complex and layered. Within this collection, each portrait offers a nuanced depiction, showcasing individuality while celebrating agency, strength, and beauty.

BEBAY GONZALEZ

Bebay's artistic exploration unearths the folklore of her Mexican heritage, rich in cultural traditions and history. She embraces the vibrant essence of popular Mexican art crafts, such as paper mache masks, ceramics, and engraving, intertwining magic and nature to symbolize profound beliefs and ancestral customs.

This exhibition serves as a powerful reminder to appreciate overlooked aspects of our culture while magnifying the significance of our inherent identity. Bebay's close collaboration in preserving Pacific Island taonga has inspired her to harmonize natural fibre extraction techniques with the craftsmanship of Mexican artisans. Whenever a new situation shifts the "other" to the center, this process simultaneously generates a new junction of disparity. This implies that we find ourselves in a state of fresh chaos, seeking value standards within individuals and groups. In the exhibition Wander on the Edge, Si Rong focuses on translating ambiguous emotions (vague pain, joy, and anxiety) from the edges of various junctions in daily life into surreal paintings and object installations. Through creation, Si Rong attempts to find shelter for both the individual and the group at this boundless vet accessible borderline.

HOLLIE RYAN

Hollie Ryan, a self-taught sculptor, delves into the sentimental value we attribute we attach to fleeting wonders of nature. Using delicate glass beads and wire, she crafts botanical sculptures that symbolize both beauty and sorrow. These intricate works capture the fragility of life and the essence of commemoration through lifelike depictions of flowers. In her first solo exhibition, Hollie invites you to consider interpretations of grief and remembrance, as well as the enduring emotional, personal, and memorial power of botany. Her creations draw inspiration from mourning practices utilising beadwork in early 19th century Europe.

EARTHLY DELIGHTS

AVARA MOODY

Earthly Delights is a collection of artworks that explores and shares the use of whenua (land) earth pigments as part of a wider ceramic practice. The whenua, is often sourced from a place of significance to the artist, including uku (clay) as well as diverse oneone (earth) pigments like kōkōwai (red earth) and pukepoto (blue earth). Avara combines different types of clay in an intricate and tactile way, evoking the organic formations found in te taiao (the natural world). Their pieces dwell in the intersection between sculptural and functional ceramics.

ANCESTRAL LAND

JULIANA DURAN

The people of "wind, sun and sand" received the gift of the spider, the knowledge of weaving. The Wayuu are one of the original native communities of the Caribbean region of South America. Throughout their existence, they have been recognized as possessors of great knowledge, maintained from generation to generation. Settled in the northern region between Colombia and Venezuela, they are currently one of the largest indigenous groups in the area. The Ancestral Land exhibition is the result of a creative laboratory where the weavers were invited to rethink the plastic and narrative possibilities of the material while sharing their local memory beyond the borders of their land.

Paul Herbert's ceramic practice is informed by relationships: between people, and between people and the Earth, which ultimately sustains us. His work invokes a connection to the natural world and, with an interest in civilisations, he uses classical sculptural forms to reflect on how we use social media and interact with others. By using examples from social media posts, the work questions our sense of humanity and self-awareness of our social media "voice" and how we seek (or reject) validation of our beliefs.




