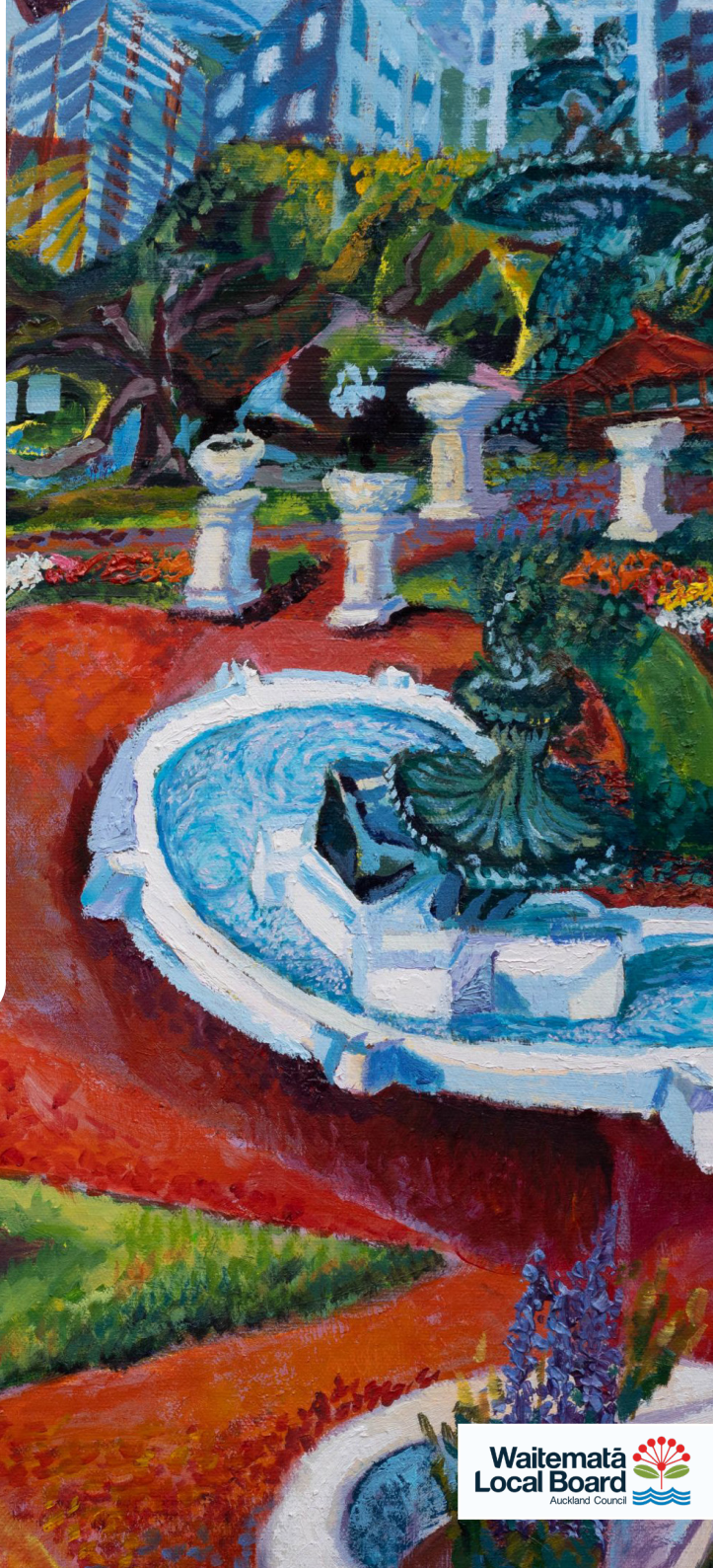

WORKSHOP HIRE

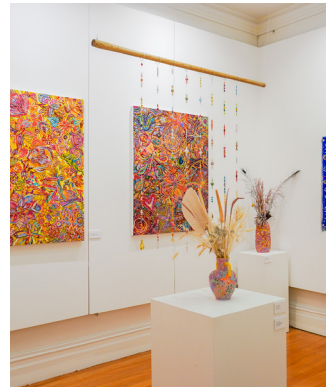

CALL FOR RESIDENCY

Our Emerging Artists Residency programme is open to applicants once a year. We select two projects annually. This annual opportunity offers successful applicants with a residency stipend, rent free studio space onsite with 24 hour access, and support through Studio One Toi Tū's resources, networks, and mentoring. Each residency concludes with a final exhibition, offering artists the chance to share their work with the community. Our next call out is planned for August 2027. ARTIST PROFILE

TERESA PETERS

MULTIDISCIPLINARY
ARTIST & FILMMAKER

CAN YOU START BY TELLING
US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT
YOURSELF?

I am a multidisciplinary creative, an artist, and a filmmaker in collaboration with Florian Habicht. My art practice is currently based in abstract explorations in clay and ceramics. I extend the physical clay based practice into other mediums like photography and audio~visual public events, involving crystalline sound and large scale digitised clay and ceramic visual scapes, e.g. *DISASTROUSFORMS.com*. In 2021 *ECHOES* won the Portage Premier Ceramic Award, the first photograph to receive the award in its 21-year history.

AS A MULTIDISCIPLINARY
ARTIST, HOW DO YOU DECIDE
WHEN TO MOVE FROM ONE
MATERIAL OR MEDIUM TO
ANOTHER?

I have a variety of professional practices, including art, ceramics, film and production design. These are separate but sometimes they inform each other and collide. There is a conceptual basis to my projects and the diverse materiality is a way of exploring this from different angles. Also, I sometimes work in collaboration with other artists, which extends the material texture and approach e.g. sound, photography and film.





ARE THERE ANY COMMON
IDEAS OR THEMES THAT
CONNECT YOUR DIFFERENT
PROJECTS AND WAYS OF
WORKING?

My art work explores pseudo-archaeology, the archive and abstract geology. Navigating the primal and the futuristic, I fuse earth bodies and the digital, and 'archive' clay and ceramic as photographic and digital 'artefacts'. Recently I have been connecting with my roots in earth art and conceptual art via my parents and their contemporaries who were part of the 1970's Post Object Art movement: forerunners in land, conceptual and experimental art in New Zealand.

I have recently exhibited with my mother Maree Horner, *EARTHED*, 2023 and my digitised clay video work *BLACK MOON* currently went on tour with Phil Dadson and From Scratch on their National tour in 2025.

WHAT ARE YOU CURIOUS ABOUT NOW? IS THERE A MATERIAL, IDEA OR DIRECTION YOU'RE EXCITED TO EXPLORE NEXT?

I am very excited about the next explorations in clay and my greater art practice, which is evolving alongside the development of feature film projects. I am currently launching a ceramic project ~ *Monsta Mugs*, (@monstamugs), featured at the moment, as part of Griffin's TVC, *Life Needs a Biscuit*. I'm also bringing my diverse skills to teaching children's classes at Studio One Toi Tū, including the school holiday class : *Monster Mug Mayhem!* (Please check out page 42)

HOW HAS YOUR EXPERIENCE OF HAVING A STUDIO IN THE CELL BLOCK AT STUDIO ONE TOI TŪ BEEN SO FAR?

I was the Studio One Toi Tū Creative ceramics resident 2018/2019. This was a great opportunity that culminated in the resident exhibition *ECHO BONE*, 2019. The cell block is a great studio and has provided the perfect catalyst for my emerging artist practice, home to various recent projects and the site where the award winning Portage photo was created.

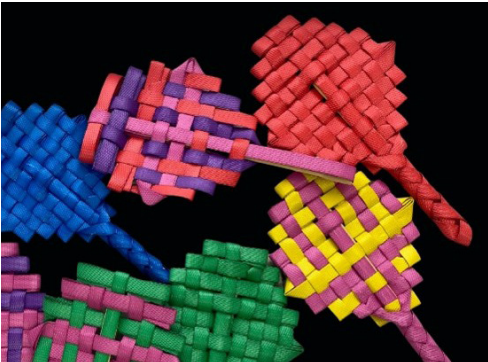

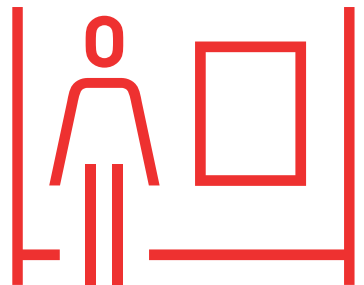

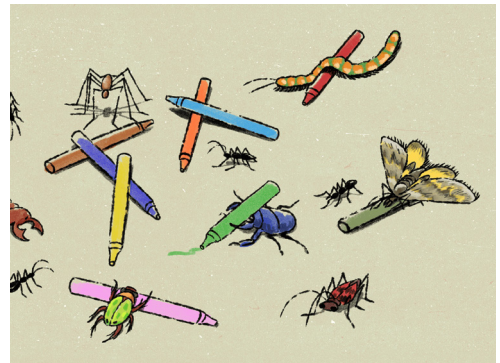
This work celebrates creativity and quiet observation, encouraging audiences to slow down, reflect, and find empathy for the small lives that sustain our world.

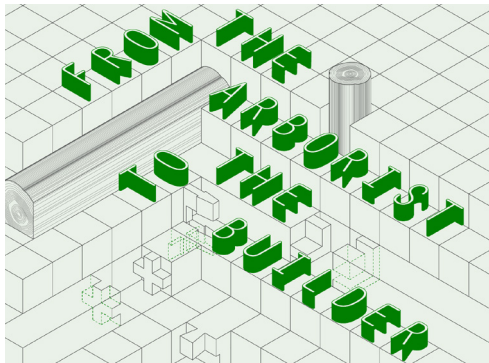

Whai mai ki Te-Aitanga-a-Pepeke, te ao o Whiro-te-tipua.

I will be a feast for all that hums is presented by *Witching Hour*, a collective of four Elam-educated artists; Madison Carroll, Meiya Julian-Takahashi, Angus Edwards, and Elise Sadlier. *A feast for all* is centred around Whiro, the Māori Atua associated with insects, darkness, decay, and transformation. The installation ushers viewers into the microscopic world, bringing to life a giant pūriri moth caught in a web. Large scale paintings explore entomology amid a garden of concrete and ceramic forms.

LINDA JARRETT

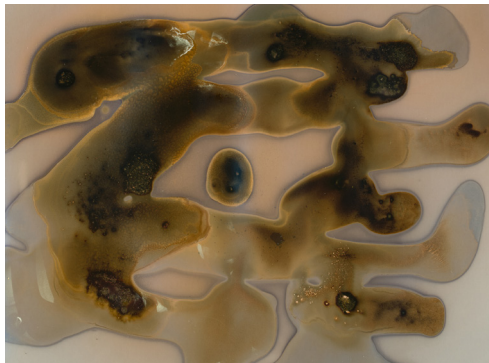
This exhibition explores the hidden environmental impact of concrete through analogue photography and experimental photographic processes. By using concrete dust, limestone and wet concrete to create the prints, the material becomes part of the artwork itself. The resulting images encourage viewers to look beyond concrete's everyday presence and consider its role in shaping landscapes, communities and the environment, revealing both its creative potential and its destructive consequences.

Coexisting Reflections brings together a series of abstract collage works and mixed-media paintings exploring the natural world. The exhibition celebrates the meeting of different materials and processes, exploring the ways they reflect, absorb, and respond to light.

LINLEY WILKINSON

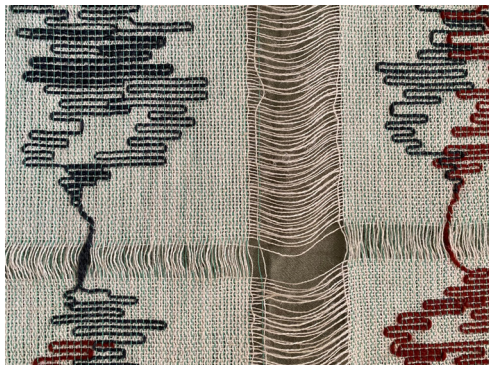
Stray Thoughts illustrates our connecting thoughts, dreams and memories as we journey through life. Linley Wilkinson uses hemp woven with a wool overlay to explore how these connections do not always take a straight path, instead becoming a tangled mass that forms our present identity and what we may become. When viewed closely, we can see that this tangled mass is a sophisticated arrangement of lines and spaces, nature working at its best inside us all.

TAKING SHAPE

NINA BULGAKOVA

In this new body of work, Nina Bulgakova explores how personal boundaries shift through the process of adaptation. The works combine sand-textured reliefs with paint, built up in layers over time. The flowing, shifting forms become a metaphor for adapting to a new environment, while the sand offers a way of grounding through material, acting as a physical anchor amid change. The meditative nature of the process is reflected in the resulting forms: quiet, layered, changing, and reaching for balance.

Woven Spaces explores patterns of rhythm and light. Using hand and loom structures, Kelly Thomson weaves together plant fibres and yarns, creating formal and informal grid structures of varying textures, densities, methods, and materials. Each work experiments with contrast; playing with irregularity, disrupting and maintaining borders, and the relationship between transparency and materiality. The works become material drawings in space.

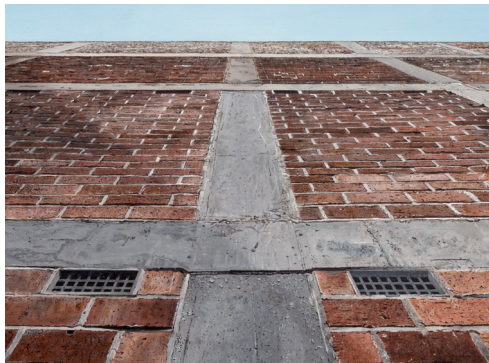

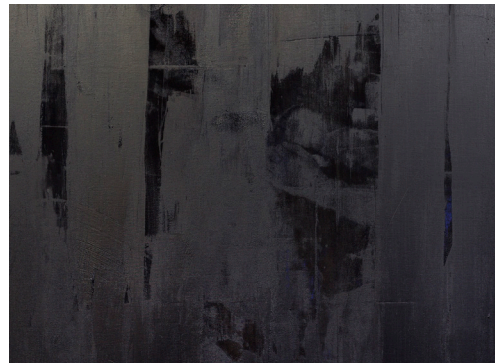

MARK WHIPPY

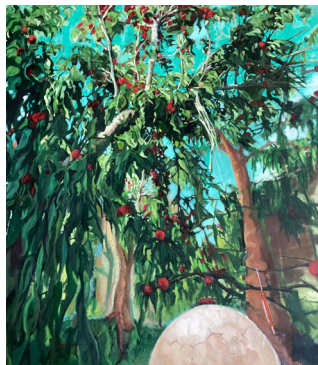

For the past 10 years he has kept notes about bizarre dreams, with the aim of at one point recreating them on canvas. Through this process of remembering old dreams and attempting to bring them to life through painting and animation, Mark further explores the metaphors and symbolism experienced in them, while also playing on the tradition of spirituality in dreams.

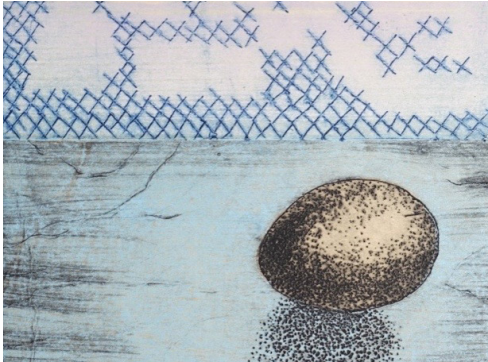

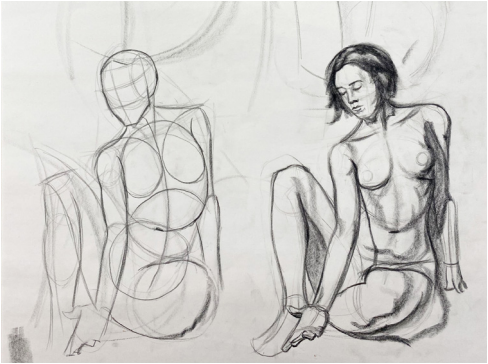

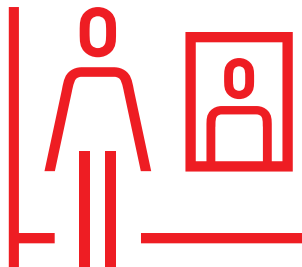
